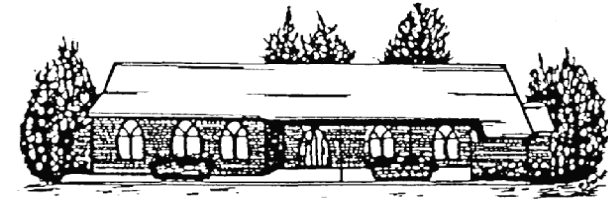
**'Of course I want to!'

The pine represents the stability of our faith, hidden and quiet, but waiting to be discovered. The Wattle is a bright and new birth, a sign of hope for nature after a lean winter, a lovely sight in the bush. A patch of promise, like the wonder on a new communicant's face".
