### The other side...

When we were young, our hopes were high, our spirits strong, and our faith firm.

Our life then was very hard, because Mark, the baby, the fourth child in the family was a spastic child unable to walk, talk or hear. When we knew he was spastic, and all that entailed, we knew that his life and ours were going to be difficult in the extreme. But when we found he was deaf also, that seemed to complicate things more. Now he was to be cut off from all the obvious means of communication, as it was impossible for him to learn the language of the deaf. He had no co-ordination in his hand movements. So here we had a beautiful child, intellectually unimpaired, but locked up within himself – no sounds, no speech, no walking and very little co-ordination of movements. But in those early days we were determined to make the best of what we had, to make the good things better, and the hard things work for us.

With God's help, we succeeded beyond our expectations. Our children were able to grow living every day with the reality of patience, love, endurance, and understanding. Thirty years on, Mark sits in his wheel chair, a fine healthy man, with a truly beautiful disposition, an extremely happy person...indeed a perfect soul. What else could any parent wish for their child, but happiness, peace and joy? Mark has succeeded in gaining all of these. They are his gift and his contentment. His main communication is with his beautiful eyes and lovely smile, the same smile for everyone. He is known, recognised, acknowledged and accepted as he is: the love that he gives and receives...

### ... of the mountain

...I do not presume to understand the ways of the Lord, but if I were asked for a reason for Mark's life of handicaps, I could answer thus: he has done great things for us. He has drawn love and compassion (not pity) from all who share his life. He has given so many the chance to understand the joy of giving. Sometimes it takes an accident or disaster to bring out the best in people, giving them an opportunity to do things they would never do otherwise. So it is with handicapped people, they are the channels through whom many great gifts are given and received. They are their own strong link in the chain of life.

Mark is God's greatest gift to me. Not just to me, to our whole family and to all who come in contact with him. He touches us all, influences everyone who shares his life.

Mark was born on the feast of the Transfiguration, and that is why I have called this story 'The Other Side of the Mountain'. (Joyce)
