



Shared celebration

Spending a weekend in the country, I had the opportunity to attend Mass on the feast day of the founder of the religious congregation who owned the property where I was staying. At the conclusion of a joyful Mass, one of the Brothers who lived on the property announced that because the day was fine, the grapes growing on a certain part of the property needed to be picked. He invited the congregation – especially those with secateurs! – to help with picking, after which they would be served lunch, and offered the opportunity to taste the wines already produced from home-grown grapes.



I reflected that this was Eucharist - a shared prayerful celebration, shared labour, and shared fruits of that labour. Incidentally, the grapes picked were to be used to produce altar wine! (Tracey)
