

R.C.I.A. Update

In the 4th and 5th centuries the 40 days prior to Easter, which we know as Lent, were the final stages of preparation for those being baptised (this was a dangerous event due to persecution of Christians). The whole church community prayed and fasted in solidarity with the candidates for their final stage of preparation leading to Baptism.

Since Vatican II, the R.C.I.A. has been reintroduced to the Catholic Church as the normal way of preparing adults for baptism and has become more visible in parishes including our own. As we see parishioners prepare for and receive the Sacraments of Initiation during the Easter Vigil, Lent regains that "baptismal' emphasis. Lent is a time for all Christians to recall their Baptismal Commitment, which we renew during the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Liturgies. We deepen our relationship with Christ through the Sunday readings, which in Lent relate to our faith journey and our basic baptism call to be part of Christ and His mission. As we gather for Eucharist we are called, to be transformed by the Word of God and the Body of Christ we receive. We do this in solidarity with those preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation in our parish and in the wider Christian Community.

Earlier this year we formally met our candidates in the Rite of Welcome during our Sunday Liturgy. A few weeks ago, Christine Burke was confirmed and received into the church and her son, Oliver, baptised. During the Easter Vigil, Dulcie Davis will also be received into the church and confirmed. Anita Tyson is starting out on her journey towards being received later this year or next Easter.

RCIA is a process and the personal journey is taken at the individual's pace. Due to personal circumstances, Debra Heim and Ron Davis have decided not be received into the church this Easter.

Let us keep Christine, Ron, Debra, Anita and Dulcie in our prayers, as we continue our Lenten journey, preparing our hearts for the great celebration of God's love, Easter. And let us pray for one another. *Michelle Davis*
