"More than any other Evangelist, Luke portrays Jesus at meals. He eats not only with tax collectors and sinners. but with friends like Martha and Mary; and he dines frequently with Pharisees.

Echoing Mary's vision in the Magnificat. Jesus invokes the theme of reversal—those who exalt themselves will be humbled, while the humble will be exalted. Since the meals of Jesus throughout Luke have eucharistic overtones. this Gospel can suggest proper 'etiquette' for our celebrations. Eating with Jesus should be a time of healing, which can shock even customary religious sensitivities. Liturgy should be inclusive of those whom our society today views as unworthv or unclean."
