



"Always be joyful. Never worry about anything."

Philippians is a very joy-filled letter. Sometimes it's not easy to feel joyful, but that's exactly when you need to hear these words. I was feeling anything but joyful and feeling overburdened with worry. Paul's words urged me to hand it over to God.

I poured it all out—why I wasn't feeling joyful, why I felt fragile in mind and spirit—and asked for God's peace. I listened long and the answer came in this way: If I can be joyful, I can lift others, for if my dark cloud is apparent to others it drags them down too.

So I understand why Paul urges this message on us. It's like the Ignatian teaching on desolation and consolation, or the story of the leather bracelet that the teacher gave the student and told him to look at it whenever he felt happy or sad. The message inscribed was: 'This too will pass.'
