



#### ON BAPTISM:

We are privileged today to share in the baptism of the second daughter of a local Blackheath family, the Malafants. The daughter's name is to be **Alicia Deanne**, now a little over six months old. As seems to be normal practice in this parish, this baptism is to be celebrated within the 9.30am Mass. We congratulate her family, and particularly Alicia, on her baptism for she is about to become a full member of God's family – a Christian – a Catholic – and a member of our very close Blackheath parish family.

While the Catholic Church has 7 sacraments – Baptism, Confirmation, Penance (Reconciliation), Eucharist, Marriage, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick (a healing sacrament), none of the other 6 sacraments may be received until that person has been baptised. Baptism opens the door to the other 6 sacraments. It is, therefore, to be referred to as the 'foundational' sacrament.

Baptism is as old as Christianity itself, dating back to Jesus' own baptism in the Jordan by John the Baptist when Jesus was about thirty years of age, and immediately after which he began his public ministry.

Ours is a Trinitarian Baptism in that we are baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We then become an adopted child of God and a full sister/brother of our Saviour Jesus.


Through Baptism Alicia, in spirit, will die to sin (original sin) and be resurrected to eternal life in and through Jesus' Death and Resurrection. A great mystery to us and a dogma of faith for us.

The word 'baptism' is taken from the Greek word for 'plunge' or 'immerse'.
