



THE ROSARY - IT'S EVOLUTION!

Given that October is the month of the Holy Rosary, it is an obvious time to reflect on its emergence for us. That evolution has taken many centuries.

Development of the Rosary can be traced back to the Bible's 150 Psalms, which were divided into three groups of 50. Those who could read sang the Psalms, while those who could not read, recited 150 prayers they had learnt, usually Our Fathers!

The Marian aspect of the devotion developed about the 11th or 12th Centuries, with the popularity of the Hail Mary, especially in England. Historically, St Dominic had great devotion to the Mother of God, and instilled that devotion into the men and women who followed his way of life in the Dominican order.

At the beginning of the 14th Century, the 150 Hail Marys were divided into 15 decades of 10 and were preceded by an Our Father. It was not until late in the 15th Century that another Dominican, Alan de la Roche, composed themes for meditation while reciting the 150 Hail Marys. The theme for the first 50 was The Incarnation, the next 50 The Passion, and for the remainder, The Resurrection, Ascension and Glorification.

The prayer component of the Rosary had a gradual evolution, so that today we have Four Mysteries, comprising 5 decades and each decade comprising 1 Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and 1 Glory Be. The Four Mysteries are Joyful, Light, Sorrowful and Glorious.

Likewise, its method of counting has a similar history, originally done by shifting small stones from one pile to the other. Later years saw the introduction of a circular loop of knotted string. This enabled persons to pray without ceasing. The knots were eventually replaced with beads.

Finally, for many people in the Middle Ages, the Holy Rosary was referred to as The Poor Man's Bible! *God Bless! Fr Bob*
