

VOCATIONS

This weekend sees the end of Vocation Week for 2009. You will recall that last weekend we concentrated our attention on lay vocations i.e. marriage and, of course, the many religious services which, though voluntary in nature, are critical to the continuing successful administration and operation of a parish such as ours. In that regard, we are particularly graced in having the services of many experienced parishioners to carry out this necessary work. However, others are needed to more equitably share with existing volunteers, those duties from which we all benefit. Hence, this invitation to you to become more actively involved in the affairs of Blackheath Parish, and join with those already committed to this most fulfilling and satisfying work.

This weekend we now focus on vocations to religious orders including the Priesthood. The biggest single difference between these vocations and lay vocations is that the latter can be incorporated into an otherwise normal family routine whereas religious vocations are exclusive in that they seek to render whole-of-life service to God through the order to which they belong. For those people wanting to consider entry into a religious order, there are a wide variety of such organisations available which offer opportunities to accommodate almost any need you may feel is calling you.

In-so-far as the Priesthood is concerned, this calling renders a highly specialized service to God through a community, be that a religious order or a parish involving diocesan priests. A calling to Priesthood (applies also to other religious) always involves academic studies plus the qualifying test of time. While every support is given to those entering upon this journey, ultimately this is a very personal choice involving both God and self! The journey to Priesthood is almost always a difficult one, but once ordained first as a transitional deacon, then as Priest, this can be a most rewarding vocation.

Without Priests, our Catholic Church cannot continue its work! They are essential to the welfare of the Church and its people! Should you feel an urge to enquire further regarding the possibility of a Priesthood for you, please contact either myself or our office. God Bless! Fr Bob

ATTENTION ALL ALTAR SERVERS

It is of the utmost importance that all water used to rinse Sacred Vessels after Mass, including that used for washing up, is poured down the Sacrarium, the special lidded sink next to the normal sink, as the Vessels may contain remnants of the Body and Blood of Christ. This sink drains directly into the soil and not into the drain pipes. Any cloths used for drying up should be placed with the altar cloths for separate washing.
