



ARMISTICE DAY

As mentioned in last week's Bulletin, we celebrated this year's Armistice Day last Thursday, 11th November, first through a special mention at the 8.00am Mass, then a sharing with the wider Blackheath and Mt Victoria communities in the 11.00am commemorative services conducted at their respective War memorials. On behalf of our Sacred Heart Parish, I participated in the Mt Victoria service and later attended the re-dedication of the recently refurbished World War I Honour Roll in the fover of Blackheath's Bates Hall.

Just for the record, out of a then national population of about 5 million people, 300,000 soldiers enlisted, 54,000 of whom were killed, while another 150,000 were injured. Fewer than 1 in 3 soldiers returned home uninjured. Such is the legacy bequeathed to us by our pioneering forefathers. Lest we forget!

REV. FR IOHN WATKINS - A FINAL WORD!

I confirm that newly-ordained Fr John Watkins is to remain at St Nicholas of Myra, Penrith under the guidance of parish priest. Fr Chris de Souza. We have sent a congratulatory card and small gift (a book of saints) on behalf of all Blackheath Sacred Heart Parishioners as a token of our gratitude to him for dedicating the rest of his life to us who live and/or work in the Parramatta Diocese.

BRITAIN TODAY - PROGRESS REPORT

Exactly one year ago, I drew attention to Britain's degeneration into a de-Christianized society. This week I have received confirmation of a major step forward of benefit to that nation's Catholics. In a statement dated November 8, 2010, five (5) Church of England Bishops - Rt. Revds. Andrew Burnham, Keith Newton, John Broadhurst, Edwin Barnes and David Silk - have resigned..." from public Episcopal ministry forthwith, resigning from our pastoral responsibilities in the Church of England with effect from 31st December 2010, and seeking to join an (Catholic) Ordinariate once one is created." I cannot help but wonder whether Pope Benedict's recent tour of the UK might have been an influence in this significant collective decision. So let us pray for all UK Christians, Catholic and Church of England alike, that they may live and work ever more closely together for God's greater benefit.

THE MASS IS CHANGING. HOW AND WHY? How will the new translation do that?

It draws more upon English's historic vocabulary for worship than on everyday forms of speech. The more word-for-word translation also allows more of the richness of the Latin rite of the liturgy to shine through into English. Experience also has shown that trying to make the Mass sound contemporary leads to a desire to tinker with the texts - in part because everyday language changes rapidly in comparison with traditional, elevated language.
