VOCATIONS

This weekend sees the end of Vocation Week for 2010. Last weekend, we concentrated our attention on lay vocations. Today, we concentrate on vocations to religious orders, including the priesthood, sisterhood and brotherhood. The biggest single difference between these vocations and lay vocations is that the latter can be incorporated into another normal family routine, whereas, religious vocations are exclusive in that they seek to render whole of life service to God through the order to which they belong. Insofar as the priesthood is concerned, this calling renders a highly specialised service to God, through a community, be that a religious order or a parish regarding diocesan priests.

A calling to priesthood always involves academic studies, plus the qualifying test of time. While every support is given to those entering upon this journey, ultimately, this is a very personal choice involving both God and self. The journey to priesthood is almost always a difficult one, but once ordained, first as a transitional deacon, then as priest, this can be a most rewarding vocation.

Without priests, our Catholic Church cannot continue its work. They are essential to the welfare of the church and its people! Should you feel an urge to enquire further the possibility of priesthood, or other religious vocation, please contact either myself or our office.

DIOCESAN WORKS APPEAL (DWF)

The next DWF collection is scheduled for 22nd August. Our quota is \$1,795.00. In recent times, our special collections have accounted for approximately half of that quota, the rest has had to be given to the Diocese from our general funds. So, any extra effort you can make to bridge this gap would be to the benefit of all, and much appreciated by all parishioners.

Today is the Feast of the Assumption of our Lady into heaven, on this rare occasion where it is concurrently celebrated with our normal Sunday Mass. However, the Mass itself will be that prescribed for the Feast of the Assumption.

THE MASS IS CHANGING - HOW AND WHY! continued... When will the new translation go into effect?

This has not yet been decided. The date may be announced when the Holy See gives final approval to the remaining parts of the translation. Once approval is given, a period will follow to allow publishers to produce new editions of the Roman Missal and to educate the clergy and the faithful about the new translation. Publishers have requested at least a year to do their work.

It has been suggested that the beginning of the liturgical year – Advent – would be an appropriate time for the new translation to go into effect. Considering these factors, we may speculate that Advent 2011 is a possible date, but we will have to wait and see.
