

MAKE UP OF THE EUCHARIST

A couple of weeks ago I was asked by the Sacramental Group to prepare for them a summary of the make up of the bread and wine used in our Eucharist. For those of you who are not aware of the composition of our Eucharist, I pass on the information I gave the Sacramental Team as follows:

Bread - must be made of wheaten bread and baked. It has to be unleavened, that is, no yeast is used. Natural water has to be used. They cannot be stockpiled, and must be recently made. We replenish our stocks of bread on a regular monthly basis.

Host - When consecrated, the bread is changed through a process known as "transubstantiation", into the real presence of Jesus Christ. The word 'Host' comes from ancient pagan times and referred to victims used in a sacrifice. Jesus is our sacrifice contained within a host for our consumption.

Wine - Provided that the wine is wholesome, its colour does not matter, be it red or white. When consecrated by the priest, Jesus is equally present in both host and wine which is called 'blood' because that is the nature of its consecration.

ANOTHER VIP - FR. JOHN ALT

Last Wednesday morning (1st September), Fr John Alt concelebrated the morning mass with me. Fr John was in the same ordination class as last week's VIP, Fr Chris Baker, and, of course, is now retired. Some of our parishioners may recall Fr John being here to administer this parish 31 years ago in 1979! He was here immediately prior to Fr Kevin Hay, and is also a friend of Fr Frank Vaughan who was Parish Priest at Blackheath from 1965 to 1970 (Fr Frank is now at Normanhurst Parish in retirement at 92 years of age!). Fr John has a sister just admitted to Lithgow Retirement Village so we may see more of him from time to time. He lives in West Ryde and was one of the original Duck Creek priests, that is, he was one of the Sydney Archdiocesan priests resident at Lidcombe when the original Parramatta Diocese was first formed, the boundary being Duck Creek located between Clyde and Auburn. I can find no record whatever of a Fr John Alt being here in our records, even though his stay was of short duration. Perhaps we can remedy that omission in any future additions of our parish history!

DIOCESAN WORKS APPEAL (DWF)

Total collections over the last 2 weeks amounted to \$821.00. As our compulsory contribution to the DWF on this occasion is \$1,795.00, we have had to take \$974.00 out of our general funds in order to comply with the requirements of the Diocese. This shortfall is disappointing because it limits other activities which we have planned to do. Perhaps we can achieve better results next time round.

ANNUAL AUDIT

Was undertaken by the Parramatta Diocese last Wednesday. Once more, our records are in perfect order, so congratulations to Marilyn, Patricia, Sue Holz and our Finance Committee for their due diligence during the past year.
