FEAST OF OUR LADY'S ASSUMPTION: Outside of Sundays, this Feast of the Assumption is one of two only Holy Days of Obligation in the Church (Christmas Day is the other). THE MASS IS CHANGING - HOW AND WHY! continued

How did the process work? After ICEL (International Commission on English in Liturgy) completed drafts of different sections of the new translation, copies were circulated to the bishops' conferences for their input. After their input was incorporated, the bishops' conferences then approved the revised drafts and forwarded them to the Holy See for review by the Congregation for Divine Workshop and the Discipline of the Sacraments. This congregation, which is responsible for the final modification and approval of the texts, is assisted by an advisory group of English-speaking bishops known as the Vox Clara (Latin, "Clear Voice") committee.

What is the status of the translation now? The bishops have reviewed the different segments of the new translation and the matter is now in Rome's hands. The Congregation for Divine Worship has given its approval to the new translation of the "ordinary" of the Mass – that is, the prayers that form a regular part of the celebration, such as the introductory and concluding rites, the Creed, and the Eucharistic Prayers. Now the Congregation is examining what is called the "proper" of the Mass, those parts that change based on the liturgical day, such as major feasts and the celebration of particular saints' days.
