DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

St Faustina, a humble Polish nun, was visited by Christ many times, starting in 1932. He requested that a feast be instituted dedicated to His Divine Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. This has been celebrated universally since Pope John Paul II canonized St Faustina in the Year 2000 and has been highly recommended by Pope Benedict. Jesus said "Whoever approaches the foundation of life on this day will be granted the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy". This request of Our Lord is for our modern times and follows His request to St Margaret Mary for a feast dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

Devotions in celebration of this Feast will take place today at St Bonaventure's Leura, commencing at 3pm. Prayers and devotions relating to this feast continue to shortly after 4.30pm when there will be Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, after Exposition. Confession will also be available. For those able to stay, the 5pm Sunday evening Mass is the perfect culmination for the Feast. All are invited to attend even for just part of this time of special prayer.

BEATIFICATION OF POPE JOHN PAUL II

This evening our time, Pope Benedict will beatify Pope John Paul II at the Vatican. For those who are connected to EWTN TV Channel, a live presentation of this event may be viewed. So, let us say a prayer of thanks to Our Lord for this special treatment of a great and wonderful Pope.
