

The World Day of Prayer held in our Sacred Heart Church on Friday, 4th March, was an outstanding success, with representatives from a number of different Christian denominations as well as a contingent of Buddhists, in total, about forty persons from our local area in attendance. PURCHASE OF PARRAMATTA'S OLD KING'S SCHOOL SITE

Bishop Anthony has advised of the purchase of 12% of this site adjoining Parramatta Cathedral, at a maximum purchase price of \$5.5 million, conditional on the extent of development that can be achieved on that site. The Diocese is developing a master plan for the entire site in collaboration with the government (current owners of the property). The intention is to extend our welfare, educational and spiritual services on that portion of the site we will purchase. The Cathedral will also gain much needed parking space.

Bishop Anthony believes that this is a site with enormous potential for multiple benefits for the Diocese, the people of Parramatta and greater Western Sydney, including the disadvantaged for whom we have a special responsibility.

WORLDWIDE INCREASE IN VOCATIONS TO THE PRIESTHOOD

Vatican has advised that the number of priests ordained has increased worldwide, while the number of those who have given up the exercise of the priesthood has decreased notably. The most recent official statistics refer to information from 2009. The total number of priests reported at that time was 410,593, of whom 275,542 were members of the diocesan clergy and 135,051 of religious congregations. This increased from a decade ago, when in 1999 the figures were 404,009 priests of whom 265,012 were diocesan and 139,997 religious. Thus, the total number of priests worldwide in 2009, compared to 1999, grew by 1.4% with a 4% increase of the diocesan clergy and a 3.5% decrease of the religious clergy.
