

OCTOBER - THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

Our Lady, long ago, requested that we daily pray the Rosary. Her most recent request for this to occur came out of her apparitions at Fatima in 1917. There has never been a greater need than now to heed this request and there has never been a better time than October, the Month of the Holy Rosary, for us to make that extra effort to pray the Rosary. Friday, 7th October, this year is a special day of devotion to the Holy Rosary, it being the Feast of The Holy **Rosarv.** There will be the usual 9am Mass at Sacred Heart on that day plus a midday Mass at St Canice's Church. Katoomba.

MAKE UP OF THE EUCHARIST

Occasionally, it does us good to reflect on various aspects of our Mass and so, today. I now summarise the actual makeup of the bread and wine used in our **Eucharist**.

Bread: Must be made of wheaten bread and baked. It has to be unleavened. that is, no yeast is used. Natural water has to be used. They cannot be stockpiled and must be recently made. We replenish our stocks of bread on a regular month basis.

Host: When consecrated, the bread is changed through a process known as 'transubstantiation', into the real presence of Jesus Christ. The word 'Host' comes from ancient pagan times and referred to victims used in a sacrifice. Iesus is our sacrifice contained within a host for our consumption.

Wine: Provided that the wine is wholesome, its colour does not matter, be it red or white. When consecrated by the priest, Jesus is equally present in both host and wine which is called 'blood' because that is the nature of its consecration.

FRIDAY PENANCE & ABSTINENCE

Thought you might like to know that from Friday, 16th September, 2011 the Bishops of England and Wales have restored the practice of abstinence from meat every Friday. We are familiar with this act of penance on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday but now it is extended to every Friday other than Feast Days like Christmas Day.
