

LOOKING AHEAD

As we continue our preparations for the new Roman Missal, it is easy to become overly focussed on the changes in wording alone. Rather, the advent of a new Missal is a wonderful opportunity for all of us - clergy and laity - to delve into the liturgy more deeply and more intentionally. What is it that we do in the liturgy, why do we do what we do, and how can we do it with greater devotion and attention?

More than just changes to words or rubrics, the new Missal calls us to a more profound engagement with the Mystery made present in our worship so that, transformed, we may more fully live Eucharistic lives. The new Missal is our Church's next step in following the directives of the Second Vatican Council, which called all of us to a full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy.

SILVER JUBILEE!

Twenty five years ago, on 19th May this year, the first Bishop of Parramatta Diocese (Bishop Bede Heather DD) took possession of this newlycreated Diocese. There is to be a special anniversary Mass(es) held on that day, and a range of special Jubilee material/activities are also planned to cover this important milestone in our Diocesan history. The Silver Jubilee Calendar, now being distributed (available in the Church) without charge, is but one of these activities. School competitions, the production of a 60 page Commemorative Booklet featuring the pre-history of the Diocese and regular features in both the Catholic Outlook and local newspapers are also planned for our Jubilee Year. MADRID WORLD YOUTH DAY

Last Sunday we were privileged to welcome Fr Suresh Kumar MSFS, Diocesan Youth Director, and his youth 'team' who addressed all at our 9.30am Mass. The Diocese would dearly like the Blackheath Parish to facilitate at least one of our youth to represent us at Madrid's WYD to be held in August this year. The cost will be about \$6,000 which is beyond our Parish to finance. Jonathon Gilchrist has long indicated a desire to attend Madrid and he has confirmed that interest with me and Fr Suresh during the latter half of last year. Attempts have been made to involve adjoining parishes to secure the necessary funds but, as recently as last week, that hope was dashed. So now we are on our own! The problem is that there are interim deadlines (travel, accommodation bookings, etc.), the first of which becomes due about a fortnight from now. I haven't spoken to the Finance Committee, but am confident that the Parish can find \$1,000 as its contribution to one of our keen vouth. I am also seeking another \$1,000 contribution from another source. Thus, there remains \$4,000 to be raised from other sources including that which Jonathon can himself raise. That amount would have to come from you, our parishioners, otherwise Ionathon will not be among the millions of Catholic world youth attending Madrid's WYD.

We talk a lot about doing more for our Blackheath Parish youth. We now have that opportunity. Should you be able to assist on this occasion, contact me as soon as practicable, please!


