Advice has just been received from the Parramatta Diocese that our new Altar Missals have arrived at Parramatta and waiting on us to collect them. So hopefully, in the next week or so, arrangements will be made to collect and use them here. However, I have no information in relation to the availability of personal missals. Will further advise, once I know they are available for local purchase.

MORE ON THE MASS

Repeated, again and again, many times during the Mass, we use a very familiar phrase, generally without giving any thought to its implication. That phrase is "through Christ Our Lord". The constant use of this phrase highlights for us two truths about the Mass:

- (1) The Mass is not primarily the worship of Jesus, but the worship of the Father by his children "through Christ Our Lord." For we are indeed the Father's creatures, his 'adopted' children through the sacrifices made by his Son, Jesus.
- (2) Is the truth that we never stand alone at Mass. We are one with Christ. We pray and worship "through Christ Our Lord" who is with us. Jesus is our priest, our intercessor with the Father.

Paul, in his letter to the Hebrews says 'Jesus is always able to save those who approach God through Him, since he forever tries to make intercession for them'. The Mass then, is a prayer to the Father "through Christ Our Lord".

UPPER BLUE MOUNTAINS PARISH UPDATE

Father John visited, for the first time since his operation, the Katoomba Presbytery last Wednesday. He is slowly recovering from the cancer operation and is about to embark on a course of chemotherapy. Meanwhile, he will remain at the Bishop's house in Parramatta and tells me that at some time in the near future, he will be undergoing treatment at Nepean Hospital. Please keep him in your prayers for the foreseeable future. 
