

These days, the word 'vocation' seems to be applied to whatever job someone happens to find themselves in. More traditionally, the word carries with it a sense of undertaking work that has a deliberate purpose about it and that is outwardly focused. Usually, there is a sense that there is 'importance' to the work and that it is linked to God's dream for the world. The Church has tended to use vocation in reference to religious life. The word comes from the Latin. vocare, meaning call or name. Realising to what it is we are called can be one of the great challenges of life. -from Liturgyhelp online

John announces the beginning of Jesus' ministry with humility and awe. His friends are taken by his words and follow Jesus. When Jesus asks what



they want, they politely ask where he is staying. Jesus replies, 'Come and see.' They are compelled to stay with him.

This invitation by Jesus gives them the chance to recognise their own deepest desire. Their response to this privileged time is to share the news, at once, and Jesus names Peter. This small event, so simply scripted, had enormous consequences for them and now for us. Our prayer each day during a quiet time, coupled with the examen and blessed by the Eucharist. affords us the same chances as Andrew. John and Peter—to know ourselves and to discover Jesus.
