

VOCATION SUNDAY

Today is Good Shepherd's Sunday and, also in the Parramatta Diocese, Vocation Sunday. This is the one day each year when the church focuses on vocations to religious and laity life. This is the time to address the well known shortage of religious in our church including Priests, Brothers and Sisters. The Good Shepherd (Jesus), works through his Priests and religious to bring himself and his message into the heart of all Catholics. Without Priests and religious, the church cannot continue to function. Our Vocations Director for the Parramatta Diocese (Fr Warren Edwards) has asked all Catholics to pray for vocations. His suggested prayer is: "God of life, You speak to us through the life of our Church community. In the name of Jesus, we ask you to send your Spirit so that men and women among us will respond to your call to service and leadership in our Church as Priests, Deacons, Sisters and Brothers. May those who open their hearts and minds to this call be encouraged and strenathened through our enthusiasm and support. We make this prayer through our Lord. Amen." A bookmark containing this prayer will be freely available today.

Lay vocations are also essential for the continued wellbeing of our Catholic life. Whether married or single and irrespective of our trade or profession in life, our vocation to Christ is all encompassing – a lifestyle, if you like! So, when we speak of vocations, no Catholic is excluded from that discussion. We are all part of the church with our own particular contribution to be made through our vocation in life.

CHRIST THE WORD

Given that Mass consists of both Word and Sacrament, it 'is important for us to remember that Christ himself is present in his word, since it is he who speaks when Scripture is read in Church'. Indeed, 'the liturgical celebration becomes the continuing, complete and effective proclamation of God's word. The word of God, constantly proclaimed in the liturgy, is always a living and effective word through the power of the HOLY SPIRIT. It expresses the Father's love that never fails in its effectiveness towards us.' The Church has always realised that in the liturgical action the word of God is accompanied by the interior working of the Holy Spirit who makes it effective in the hearts of the faithful.

SUNDAY MISSALS
