

### THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

With this Feast, the Christmas Season ends. The universal nature of last week's celebration of the Epiphany where the Magi represented all Gentiles (us!) means that through Jesus' Baptism, His Divine Mission on earth is directed to, and benefits every one of us. The one born among us, Jesus, is the servant of God who brings to all nations—all peoples—His universal promise of justice and the fulfilment of all our hopes in Him. This saving action of God is accomplished through His instrument, Jesus. He is, literally, our Saviour! He is the light who guides those who live in darkness!

As the heavens opened following his Baptism, Jesus was identified as the beloved one of God. Through our own Baptism, all Christians share in Jesus' prophetic and divine ministry—a commission to commit ourselves to the service of the poor, to the cause of compassion and to bring his love into our own and all other lives. Through Jesus' Baptism, we see a summary of the entire liturgical cycle that will be unfolded for us during the course of this year.
