

THE BUSHFIRE: Because of the circumstances under which this week's Bulletin is being produced, that is, on Wednesday morning with the threat of impending bushfires over all our heads, of necessity this bulletin is heavily focused on that bushfire and our survival through it. To date, we have been able to determine that only one of our parishioners has been evacuated from their home that being Maria Cora who resides on Mt York Road at Mount Victoria. You would be aware that one of the centres of the fire in that region was/is the Mt York Peninsula. Maria has taken temporary residence with her daughter who lives in Sydney. However, her home has survived.

Many people from both outside and within the mountains' community have been in contact with us to ascertain the level of danger for us under these trying circumstances. I have been particularly pleased to see the level of concern and support offered by a number of parishes in our Diocese. Bishop Anthony has also been in regular contact both in writing and by telephone, his obvious concern for our physical and spiritual welfare at this time has been most welcome for our whole community. To quote him ... "Times of great difficulty are often also times of great solidarity. As we grieve over loss of life and property, we come together to help our brothers and sisters in Christ. We pray that the fires soon abate and that God is with those most in need in these troubling circumstances. I assure you of my prayers for the victims and their loved ones, and all the affected communities." His Holiness Pope Francis has also expressed his concern for us and for all who have been affected by these fires in our region and NSW. Should you or anyone you know need support of any kind, I have people and organisations available to assist. Please do not stand on ceremony but contact me at your earliest convenience should vou need assistance.

Finally, congratulations and thanks to so many of our parishioners who, of their own accord, have supplied food and drinks for the fireys at the Mt Vic depot! Our parish has supported this effort with deliveries. Also, well done to Diana, Joe and their Mt Wilson friends for feeding about 150 fireys during this crisis.

BUSHFIRE PRAYER

Father, we know that your love, your compassion, your mercy is infinitely greater than we can ever imagine.

We, who through bitter personal experience know about bushfires, ask you, we pray, to help our suffering brothers and sisters in this crisis so that they may survive this holocaust which has destroyed, and is destroying the lives, homes, possessions and livelihood of so many of our people.

Too, we pray for the safety and wellbeing of all firefighters, many of whom have come great distances to sacrifice their time, energy and safety in an effort to protect us.

We also ask that you will make known to us ways we may assist all those in need both now and in the future.

We make this prayer through your only Beloved Son, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.
