

That is an example from which we each can draw support to work towards that same oneness in our relationships with each other and with God. We are also reminded of the obligation for us to have received the Sacrament of Reconciliation between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. That obligation carries with it the taint of serious sin.
