

Audio Visual Equipment: Following the successful installation of our audio visual equipment, we have conducted tests designed to shape its use to best satisfy our needs. We currently have in training one potential operator and we are able to use our existing software program as the basis for this operation, saving costs.

Faith in Our Future (Progress Report): Subsequent to last week's report in this matter, this week we have received from Bishop Anthony a printed report and a number of feedback forms that you will find in your pew this morning. Meetings: Sunday last, the Parish Council met. A report on matters discussed at that meeting will be verbally given at the conclusion of today's mass. A Blue Mountains Deanery meeting was also held at Glenbrook last Wednesday and two matters of interest to us came under discussion. The first related to any parishioner interested in becoming a permanent Deacon (permanent Deacons may be either married or single with or without family). The second matter of interest is the desire for our Deanery to bring together the range of independent religious courses, mostly part day, presently available in the Mountains, and to supplement those courses with additional groups to locally cover a wider range of subjects. More on this in the next few months.
