



ASSUMPTION FEAST OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY: Outside of Sundays, this Solemnity Feast of the Assumption is one of two only Holy Days of Obligation in the Church (Christmas Day is the other). This year the 15th August occurs next Friday. Two Masses will be celebrated - the first at the normal time of 9.00am, and the second in the evening at 7.00pm. Attendance at Mass on this Holy Day of Obligation is obligatory in the same way that attendance at Sunday Mass is compulsory. Failure to do so is a serious sin indeed, however, non-attendance must have been by deliberate personal avoidance for a mortal sin to be incurred. Please also note that other saints' feast days this coming week include St Clare (11/8), St Frances de Chantal (12/8), and St Maximilian Kolbe (14/8).

NATIONAL VOCATIONS AWARENESS WEEK: Today we celebrate the close of National Vocations Awareness Week. On this day in particular we are invited to pray for all those aspiring to either the priesthood or religious life. The Church celebrated the Feast Day of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop last Friday (8th August). St Mary is an inspirational model of what it means to say 'yes' to God. This week, right around our nation, we are also invited to pray for the priests and consecrated men and women who serve us, and that those whom God is calling to join them may perceive and pursue these same vocations that so enrich all of us.

SAINT JOHN VIANNEY FEAST DAY: Normally celebrated last Monday (4th August), here in Parramatta Diocese our celebrations were transferred to Wednesday just passed. This particular feast is important to every Diocesan priest, given that St John Vianney is the worldwide patron saint of all parish priests.
