GARAGE SALE: Despite the heatwave conditions over both sale days, this year's garage sale was by far our best ever! Sales totalled approximately \$5.400. compared with last year's commendable \$3,280.30 - an increase of about \$2,120 or a 64.6% increase in our 'take' this year. None of this just happens! Led by Marilyn and Patricia, the team of over 25 persons received, sorted and displayed a guesstimated 50% more stock than was handled last year. In fact, the hall, meeting room, print room, office and veranda was collectively too small for the volume of stock we had for sale. Sizzling sausage sandwiches must have broken some sort of record - I know I did my bit by consuming at least three over the two days, and in that weather! Imagine how tough it must have been for those who did the cooking? Similarly with drinks and 'cuppas'. I should point out to you that planning for this phenomenally successful garage sale actually began about mid-year last year. As a parish, we are so proud of, and grateful to, everyone who participated in the setting-up and conduct of this event. We are equally humbled by all who both donated the sale stock and bought all those wonderful bargains that were just too good to resist! I was one of the latter! As I sit at my computer penning this copy. I glance to my right to see a remarkable original oil painting leaning up against the skirting board because I haven't got a wall on which to hang it. Ah, well! The considerable volume of left-over stock (including the residual of about 3,000 books) was gratefully accepted at no cost to us by Fr Paul Hanna who is still in the process of distributing same to the needy in our society and in other places. Everyone should be 'chuffed' at this result! Congratulations all!

ANOTHER SURPRISE: Towards the end of August last year (2013). Fr Paul Hanna donated to this parish an extremely old statue of our Blessed Lady carrying a young Jesus in her arms. One glance was enough for the few who saw it to realize that this statuette was something right out of the ordinary. Made of wood, though surprisingly light, it stands about 15 inches tall in the old terminology. The design, detailed finish and colour set it apart from anything I have ever seen. It needed the attention of an expert to properly restore it to something like its original condition. I might add that the approval of the expert was sought before this work was carried out. The statue has been in the restorer's hands from late August until this week when it was collected by two of our parishioners. The \$500 cost of restoration has been paid by an anonymous donor. Despite the restorer's best efforts, the origin of this unique statuette has vet to be determined with investigations continuing as I write. This iconic masterpiece will be displayed today on the Sanctuary prior to, during and after Mass for you to view. Please, please, do NOT touch it under any circumstances! Eventually, we hope to encase this most valuable icon in a glass dome for public viewing during major liturgies. When not on display, it will not be kept on church premises! This statuette will be blessed after our final Mass Prayer today!
