EMERITUS POPE BENEDICT XVI: A little over 12 months ago, Pope Benedict XVI did what no other pope had done in 600 years – he resigned his position as leader of our Catholic Church close of business 28th February 2013. He had been the spiritual leader of over 1.2 billion members of our Universal Church for about 8 years, dating from 2005. Pope Benedict was 85 years of age when he retired very tired to a contemplative life, a life that he continues to practise today in his permanent residence in the Vatican's monastery "Mater Ecclesiae," which lies just west of St Peter's Basilica.

Pope Francis has recently asked the world to join him in prayer for the former pope. "Today I invite you to pray together with me for His Holiness Benedict XVI, a man of great courage and humility," the Pope said. What better time could you and I have than Lent to include our beloved Emeritus Pope Benedict XVI in our prayers and liturgies. He may be out of sight but he is never out of our minds.

IESUS - OFFICIALLY NUMBER 1: Thought you might be interested in a scientific project recently undertaken by two well-qualified Americans. Professor Steven Skiena and Google engineer, Charles Ward. Together they wrote a book titled "Who's Bigger?: Where Historical Figures Really Rank". In this publication, they included a list of the top 10 figures in human history. These included the ancients, Aristotle and Mohammed; the emperors, Alexander the Great, Napoleon and Hitler; the statesmen, Washington, Jefferson and Lincoln; and the playwright, Shakespeare. Coming in at No.1, however, is Jesus. It should not surprise us that Jesus of Nazareth is the "biggest name in human history". Not just because the Bible is by far the most published, distributed, read and influential book in history; not just because the Christian religion is the most widely spread and populous in human history; but more fundamentally for this reason: we believe that Jesus, the only Son of God incarnate, is the new "Adam" to whom the whole of humanity is tied. There can be no bigger name in human history because He is the Alpha and Omega of all history. There is, however, a "sting in the tail" for us. Christianity's influence is declining. In the hundred years between 1911 and 2011 (our most recent census) those in Australia who identified as "no religion" rose from 1 in 250 in 1911 to more than 1 in 5 in 2011. That makes "no religion" second only to Catholics in Australia today. Let's pray that our "New Evangelisation" Programme substantially reverses this trend!

THIS PAST WEEK: During this week just ended, extraordinary activities (that is, those outside our normal things) include last night's superb Trivia Night; yesterday's Catalyst for Renewal; Friday's special Retreat Mass at Mt Victoria for the 200+ St Ives Brigidine College students (they're the ones who raised \$792 for us to distribute to last year's bushfire victims in our Parish - in return we have presented to them a special "Thank You" certificate following the Mass); Thursday's funeral for Judith Harris, and Wednesday's funeral for Robert Menzies. Following today's Mass, little Jack Commons is to be baptised. Thank you everyone involved for your support in enabling us to successfully complete these tasks.
