

ASCENSION SUNDAY: Today we celebrate the second of the three major feasts that collectively make up the Easter Season. First, of course, was Easter Sunday and the Resurrection from the dead by Jesus. Today, we celebrate His return to His Father in Heaven via the feast we call the Ascension. Last of all is the Feast of Pentecost where we celebrate the descent of the Paraclete (the Most Holy Spirit) to be our Advocate and to take Jesus' place among all people, then and now. Tradition sort of tells us that Jesus' Ascension took place in the same Garden of Gethsemane where He had just a few weeks earlier suffered the beginning of the trauma that was His Passion and Death. However, Luke's version of this event would have us believe that Jesus ascended into Heaven from Bethany, a village then about 3kms from Jerusalem. So! Take your pick! I happen to think it was the Garden of Gethsemane, but I have no proof! With Iesus on this occasion were those closest to Him. to bear witness to His physical departure from us to His home - Heaven, from whence He had originally come to us! We perhaps need to be reminded that once ascended into Heaven, Jesus, as our Saviour, has supported us individually, personally, on our difficult journey in this life, and in the judgement to follow that we each have to face.

MONEY MATTERS: First, all those collections to which you have contributed during Lent and Easter. The Holy Land Good Friday total was \$442.55; Catholic Mission raised \$394.00; while Caritas results are not yet available. Finally, a reminder that today is the second (last) collection for the **DWF** this time around. When added to all our other commitments around the period in question, this result has to be above expectations. In-so-far as Parish finances are concerned. April results show a small net operating loss. However, included in April expenditure was the cost of the 'carpeting' of pew kneelers throughout the Blackheath church. Year-to-date we are in better shape than we have ever been in the five and a half years I have been here. However, a good deal more needs to done that will require much of the funding we have in reserve. Both vour Finance Committee and the Parish Council are overseeing that work and those costs. Well done, everyone! A final comment on finances; we never detail our specific finances in this, or for that matter any other publication, as it can draw unwanted attention to our funding status. However, those figures are available to you at any time. Simply contact the office or me, and we will get a copy of them for you. Sorry about that! It's the way of the world today!

Because I have to break into my holidays for one day for a meeting with Bishop Anthony that involves all parishes in the Blue Mountains Deanery, I will not now be returning to work until Wednesday, 18th June. These will be the only masses available during my absence. Huge thanks, Father Paul!
