

ANOTHER YEAR IN GOD'S SERVICE: Welcome everyone to this, the first full edition of our Bulletin for 2014. Thanks to our new multi-functional photocopier bought late last year, we are now printing our own Bulletins, including this edition. As ever, this is going to be another year filled with many interesting and challenging activities and events. So, here is a list of some of those activities and dates:

Today is Australia Day (26/1) with its own special Mass. Monday (27/1) (tomorrow) Mass will be celebrated at Blackheath at 9.30am, followed by our annual picnic at Withycombe, Mt Wilson (thanks, once again, to Joe and Diana Landsberg). (See elsewhere in this Bulletin for more details). Other events and dates include – the return of most schools (30/1); the year's first Parish Pastoral Council meeting (2/2, after Mass); DWF Collection (2/2 & 9/2); Parish Garage Sale (8/2 & 9/2); special Vigil Mass, Megalong Valley (22/2); presentation of completed Diocesan Faith in our Future Consultative Action Report (22/2 & 23/2); Ash Wednesday (5/3); Trivia Night (St Patrick's Feast) (15/3); Daylight Saving ends (6/4); Palm Sunday (13/4); Easter Sunday (20/4); ANZAC Day (Friday 25/4); Canonization of Blessed Popes John XXIII and John Paul II (May); Annual Parish Dinner (27/6 date to be confirmed); Diocesan Audit of our Parish (17/9); Sacrament of Confirmation (21/9); Melbourne Cup Fun Day (4/11).

That's all I have available at this time, as accurately as I am able to determine.

SOME ISSUES AND PROJECTS:

- The Royal Commission into Institutional Child Abuse will be with us throughout this year with its obvious deleterious effect on us and our Catholic Church. This disaster affects us as individuals and as a community, so it goes without saying that I will keep you informed on every development in this matter as that occurs.
- At last, on 22nd and 23rd February, Bishop Anthony will present to us for implementation, the Diocesan Faith in our Future Consultative Programme. So, we have only a few weeks to wait before that happens, and we see what changes are in store for all 49 parishes in the Parramatta Diocese, including our own Sacred Heart. Projects already listed for completion this year include production of the elusive household distribution brochure that has been planned for so long; audio-visual equipment installation in the parish hall; and glazing (soundproofing) of the sacristy windows. There are other projects proposed, though these have yet to be considered by the Parish Council.
- The canonization of our two recently deceased popes John XXIII and John Paul II, in May, will undoubtedly be a massive project for the entire Universal Church in which this Parish will be expected to play a leading role in our wider local community.

PARISH FINANCES: While these figures have yet to be ratified by both the Finance Committee and the Parish Council, I can safely say that I am happy with our present position which should be further improved once the Garage Sale is finalized. However, I do draw your attention to the commitment we have to the Parramatta Diocese via the Diocesan Works Fund (DWF) collections, the first instalment of which is due next Sunday, 2nd February. Please give what you can to support those many Diocesan programmes from which we both directly and indirectly benefit.

So there it is, this year previewed for you as best I can! I pray that this will be a great year for each of you, and for our wonderful Sacred Heart Parish.
