

ABORIGINAL & TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY: Todav is the one dav of the year when we especially focus our attention on those people I described last week as being "the poorest of the poor", the opportunities that presents to us to do something positive to alleviate their sometimes desperate situations.

The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) represents Indigenous Catholics in Australia. I can do no better than to quote that when it says "... The culture, circumstances and the variety of ways that our people celebrate the Word of the Lord form a 'patchwork' of beauty and diversity, NATSICC wants to highlight and promote these gifts as they add colour and texture to the Church - serving to open her doors to people of all backarounds. The theme of the resource this year is "Praise to you, Lord of *Heaven and Earth*". A range of print material encompassing their unique Catholic way of life has been supplied to us and will be used during this Mass. I conclude with a statement by Deacon Boniface Perdjert, Wadeve NT when he says "... Deep down, we Aborigines are religious people. We did not have many material goods, but we are rich with spiritual goods. It is this strong religious side that made us. It gave us our identity, our dianity, our self-assurance. My people existed here in Australia thousands of years before Abraham. In all that time, God was with my people. He worked through their culture. He was saving us despite our human weakness. He was preparing us for the day we would see the features of Aborigines in the image of His Son." So, let us acknowledge their past and current presence among us, and support them in every possible way.
