

BISHOP'S COLLECTION FOR RETIRED PRIESTS AND CLERGY: The Clergy Support Foundation of the Diocese of Parramatta assists in meeting the needs of the retired and sick priests of the Diocese, and an annual appeal, the Bishop's Collection for Retired and Sick Clergy, is held on Father's Day each year to support the Foundation. It is hoped to raise \$200,000 each year through this appeal.

Last year we reached this amount and the Foundation thanks you for this contribution. This year the appeal in the Diocese will be held today.

While the normal first and second collections will remain unchanged, a special third collection will be taken this weekend at each Mass after the Gospel, and before the homily. Also, during the collection a short video relating to this topic will be shown. Special envelopes are available in front of you on the pews and all donations over \$2 are tax deductible. If you wish to claim a tax deduction, please tick the box and write your details clearly on the envelope.

Should you wish, you can make online contributions at csfparra.org.au using your credit card. Tax deductible receipts for those who request them will be sent by February 2015. Thank you for your generosity.

Note: Your donation will significantly help our 25 Parramatta retired clergy comprised of 2 Bishops, 21 priests and 2 Deacons. Last financial year, the Foundation spent about \$600,000 caring for the needs of these retired priests. So, thank you for caring, and thank you for helping!

NEW BEGINNING FOR WILCANNIA-FORBES: After years of uncertainty about its future, the Diocese of Wilcannia-Forbes welcomed one of its own as its new Bishop. The Episcopal Ordination of the Most Reverend Columba Macbeth-Green OSPPE as the new Bishop of Wilcannia-Forbes took place recently in Parkes. The Principal Ordaining Bishop was His Excellency, The Most Reverend Paul Gallagher, the Apostolic Nuncio in Australia. 30 Bishops were present at the ordination, including a past Administrator of that Diocese, our own retired Most Reverend Kevin Manning DD. Bishop Columba was born in Forbes and worked as a priest in the nearby Wagga Wagga Diocese.
