

"DON'T MESS WITH MARRIAGE": Last week the Catholic Bishops of Australia produced a Pastoral Letter to all Australians on the "Same-sex Marriage" Debate. Copies of that letter were made available to every parishioner in booklet format last week. They will again be available today at the entrances to the church. I put it to you that this is a battle that every family has to win, OR, see the value of their unique, most intimate of all personal relationships greatly depreciated by the broadening of the meaning of your marriage in our society. This is not about a simple name change, or a sharing of the same name in your relationship with another: it IS all about imparting a whole new meaning to all (then) marriage relationships. Marriage is, to me, a lifetime commitment by two people - one a male, the other, a female - who live together as a single unit to reproduce their species - children! This is no easy achievement! The begetting of a child or children, and their rearing into mature, self-sufficient adults requires the life-long, dedicated and loving commitment of the two parents. Marriage, real marriage, is no soft option, and its primary definition is focussed around that function. Same-sex so-called "marriages" cannot satisfy that need. Therefore, those 'couples' have to rely upon other surrogates to complete at least half of the reproductive function for them should they so choose. Genetically, that opens up a whole series of other possible complications for the same-sex couples. So, I invite you to say "no" to this proposal.

Not canvassed in the Catholic Bishops' "Don't Mess With Marriage" booklet is what to do next! That question is answered on a "Fight for Marriage" article that you will find printed on an A4 sheet placed next to the Bishops' Booklets at each of the three entrances to the church. Additionally, a copy will be displayed on the Notice Board.

SEA SUNDAY: Today is also Sea Sunday - that one day each year when we are encouraged to support those engaged in the transportation of both goods and people around the globe. Over 1.2 million seafarers are currently employed in this work, worldwide! The issues that confront seafarers are not confined to transporting goods to Australia, but they also carry exported goods from Australia to the world as well. Seafarers are important for our economy and our balance of payments. Seafarers are not a number. They are not a commodity. They are people who spend much of their lives at sea, away from their homes and families, accommodated mostly in cramped quarters working long shifts. Contrary to popular belief, most are not well paid. Improving technology means that these seafarers spend very little time in ports these days because of the very short turn-around times that apply. The theme for today's Sea Sunday is "THE STELLA MARIS GLOBAL FAMILY", in which the Apostleship of the Sea is the Catholic Church's evangelisation response to both male and female seafarers working on vessels throughout the world. There will be a leaving collection today for all who want to contribute to this most worthy cause.
