

ADVENT WREATH: Third Sunday of Advent (Theme: "Celebration")

Today, during our candle lighting liturgy, the purple candles previously lit over the past two weeks will again be lit – plus the pink candle set down for lighting this day. We need to understand the meaning of these different candles. The candles are traditionally lit in the following order: purple, purple, pink, purple, white. The first is called the "Candle of Hope". It symbolizes faith in God keeping His promises to humanity. The second is called the "Candle of Preparation", reminding Christians to get ready to receive God. The third pink candle is the "Candle of Joy". It recalls the angels joyfully singing about the birth of Christ. The fourth candle, the "Candle of Love", reminds Christians that God loves them enough to send His only Son to Earth. The "Christ Candle", the white candle in the centre, stands for Jesus Christ Himself and is lit for the Christmas celebrations.

GAUDETE SUNDAY: Today is Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is from the Latin and means "rejoice". For those who have Advent Wreaths, this is the day when the pink candle is lit to emphasise the change in direction that now takes place in our preparation for Christmas. From this Sunday, we focus more on Mary, soon to be Jesus' mother, as may be seen from our scripture readings.

Week 3: Lighting of the two purple candles and the pink candle:

From Isaiah we read, "The people who walk in darkness have seen a great light." God of Blessings, we celebrate your good gifts and rejoice in the gift of your Son, Jesus." As the candle is lit, we all say: "Let this candle remind us that Jesus is coming and in Him we rejoice".

SECOND RITE OF RECONCILIATION: Timed to commence next Wednesday, 16th December at 7.30pm here at Blackheath, I am sorry to advise that Fr Paul Hanna who had earlier committed to be present for this Sacrament, told me late Wednesday that he is now not able to be attend. Unless something extraordinary occurs to enable another priest to join us at virtually no notice, that leaves me alone to conduct this Second Rite of Reconciliation. I don't mind if you don't mind. I will be seeking your advice at the end of today's Mass as to whether we proceed or not! Sorry for this state of affairs. I might add that these are tough times for Fr Paul. He regrets this situation as much as the rest of us. More at today's Mass!

"Christmas Vigil in the Forest" This year we are better equipped to celebrate the Christmas Eve Vigil Mass (the children/family Mass) down in the forest area below Father Bob's house and garage. Limited seating will be provided for those who really need it, however, for the rest who attend, your own picnic rugs and/or fold-up chairs would be the answer. Lighting into the area where Mass is to be celebrated is already in situ, supported by a new special battery-operated PA system to magnify both the spoken voice and our choir. The Mass should be concluded before full darkness descends upon us so as to accommodate the needs of families with younger children. All we need is fine weather for that day and evening to enable this Mass to proceed. However, should the weather be inclement (bad), we will adjourn to the church as has been the case in past years. Here's hoping!

PAPAL BLESSING: Tuesday week past (1st December) I not only attended the special Carrington Hotel's ICAC gathering, but also a meeting of Diocesan priests held at Mt Schoenstatt, Mulgoa attended by Australia's new Apostolic Nuncio. Towards the end of that seminar, three priests were presented with Papal Blessing Certificates by the Nuncio. Surprisingly, I was one of those recipients. Normally, these are given after a minimum 25 years of priestly service. I had just managed 11 years. Perhaps someone thought I might not make the 25 years. .../continued
