LAETARE SUNDAY: Today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is one of the two occasions in our Church year when the priest is entitled to wear pink vestments. I might add that this is an optional choice which is just as well as I don't possess vestments of that hue. The word "Laetare" is taken from the first word of today's Entrance Antiphon whose English translation from the original Latin means "Rejoice with Jerusalem!". I remind you that the other Sunday for pink vestments is "Gaudete" Sunday that occurs on the Third Sunday of Advent. From this Sunday forward, our attention will particularly focus on Jesus' Passion, Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection.

SAINTS OF THIS WEEK: This is a great week for two great Feast Days of two great saints - St Patrick (Tuesday 17/3) and St Joseph (Thursday 19/3). Mass times for each will be as normal, 6.30pm for St Patrick and 8.00am for **St Ioseph.** There are no other special celebrations planned by us this year for either/both saints.

OTHER SPECIAL ACTIVITIES: Last Friday, at the beautiful Lutanda Retreat Centre at Mt Victoria, we shared the Annual Retreat Mass for the 200+ senior St Ives' Brigidine College students. They're the students who, along with the rest of their college, raised \$792 for our bushfire-affected people. At last, this week, arrangements have been made to pass that money to the Shipley Rural Fire Service. More on this subject once the funds have changed hands.

Second: Last night at St Joseph's Megalong Valley's Vigil Mass, the "house full" sign went up with a large social group of eastern Upper Mountains residents in attendance. This is a twice-yearly event that is followed by a BBO. They are a great bunch, and they can cook!

FINANCES: Thanks to all parishioners and the wider community, we made another welcome trading profit in February (details yet to be presented to the Parish Council). This was undoubtedly due to the success of our garage sale. Financial year-to-date, we are thankfully also profitable. Congratulations everyone for your wonderful contribution to this result!

ARCHBISHOP OSCAR ROMERO'S SAINTHOOD CAUSE: Many years ago, I adopted the cause of two great departed Catholics whom, I would like to think, eventually will be elevated to full sainthood. One was the Australian Eileen Rosalind O'Connor, founder of "Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor", alias "the Brown Nurses", whose mother house, even today, is at 35 Dudley Street, Coogee. The other was Oscar Arnulfo Romero v Goldamez, born in the mountains of El Salvador in 1917. His family was not keen on him entering the priesthood but he went ahead anyway. He was ordained in 1942 and returned to El Salvador in 1944 as a country priest. In 1966 he was made secretary to the El Salvador Episcopal Conference, a position he held for 23 years. He became Auxiliary Bishop in El Salvador in 1970, Bishop of Santiago de Maria in 1974 and Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977. He spoke out fearlessly against the social injustice of the peasant economy despite government attempts to silence him. Archbishop Oscar Romero was killed by an assassin's bullet as he celebrated Mass on 24 March, 1980. He is buried in the Cathedral of San Salvador. The Vatican has now promulgated his martyrdom and his cause that, prayerfully, will lead to full sainthood for him in our lifetime. God Bless! Father Bob
