

Today we celebrate the **101st World Day of Migrants and Refugees** and our Eucharistic Liturgy will be led by **Father Pawel Barszczewski OP**, originally from Poland. Father Pawel was appointed as Assistant Priest at St Joseph's Parish Kingswood in 2013 and is also Chaplain at the University of Notre Dame, Sydney. *Welcome Father Pawel!*

Today gives us the opportunity to celebrate and acknowledge the many millions of migrants, refugees and displaced persons who have made Australia their home - we celebrate the wonderful gifts and the love they bring to our community. It is also a day when we pray for the plight of the millions of refugees and displaced persons suffering in our world today.
