TRINITY SUNDAY: Today is the Feast of God, the Most Holy Trinity, in which we celebrate the great mystery of three beings having but one single nature – a mystery in which even the great theologian Saint Augustine, despite his best efforts, was never able to resolve. I refer, of course, to the infinite love that binds each Person of the Divine Trinity – Father, Son and Most Holy Spirit – so intimately, so close, as to be absolutely at one with each other. Our readings today indirectly give us an insight into the magnificent way the three persons that make up this Beloved Trinity interact with each other. We have much to learn about our life, the way we live it, and our interdependence on both God and one another with a faith that totally unites us. The Triune God is all about unity – and the example that unity sets for us to follow.

ANNUAL CONFESSIONAL OBLIGATION: Just a reminder that the obligation for you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. Failure to abide by that obligation carries with it the taint of serious sin. Should you not have received this Sacrament within the above time frame, I fervently suggest that you do so at your earliest opportunity.

**COMMISSIONING OF SREs:** We all witnessed the formal commissioning of nine of our eleven catechists during Mass last Sunday. This is the 'team' that brings God into the classrooms of our three public schools – Blackheath, Megalong Valley and Mount Victoria – each Thursday morning during school terms. However, it is below the minimum number of volunteers needed to cover this work. Realistically, we need another two or three people to assist our Catechists in their classes. Could you be interested? If so, would you please see Claire Maguire, the Catechists Co-ordinator after Mass. Otherwise, you could phone her on 4787 7635 or me on 4787 8811.

**BEATIFICATION OF BLESSED OSCAR ROMERO:** Finally, last Saturday, 23rd May, 2015, the Beatification of Blessed Oscar Romero, former Archbishop of San Salvador took place in the presence of about 250,000 people and more than 12 heads of state. Blessed Oscar Romero spoke out against the Revolutionary Government Junta's, especially their repression of human rights. While celebrating Mass at a local chapel on 24th March, 1980, the Salvadorian prelate was assassinated. In 1990, his cause for canonization began, leading to today's Beatification.

**BAPTISM:** Following today's Mass, at 11.30am, little **Honor Jean Everingham**, daughter of local residents **Emma** and **James**, is to be baptised here at Sacred Heart. We congratulate baby Honor and, as well, her proud parents and family on her becoming a member of God's family and us, her parish family.

## Living the Gospel The Sign of the Cross

Jesus' instruction that the disciples go out to all the nations and baptise them 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit' is an instruction that is still being carried on today. Those precise words are used by the priest at every baptism. They are also the words used in the sign of the cross – whether that is a personal, private blessing of oneself or a blessing of a group as in the introductory and dismissal rites as part of a Eucharistic celebration. When we make the sign of the cross we use the words of Jesus.
