With Easter now behind us, and the remarkable Feast of Pentecost 50 days hence (15th May) from Jesus' Resurrection, we could be forgiven for thinking that liturgically, a relatively quiet period might be obtained during this time. Nothing could be further from the truth! Read on!

SOCIAL JUSTICE WORKSHOP: You may recall that during last November's Parish AGM, a decision was taken to include the formation of a Social Justice Group in our Parish Pastoral Plan. Today, following the 9.30am Mass, a workshop led by Sr Louise McKeogh from the Social Justice Office in the Parramatta Diocese, will give us an opportunity to explore how we as a Parish might best bring this about, utilizing the strengths and opportunities we have available through our volunteers and our other already-committed activities.

Pope Francis himself, in his 2016 World Day of Peace address stated: "that we all engage with the world around us, not turn our backs on suffering and injustice, and not lose hope in our human ability to conquer evil and to combat resignation and indifference."

So, please, accept the challenge! Give up an hour of your time after Mass to hear Sr Louise and the invaluable experience and knowledge on this subject that she has come all this way to share with us. Opportunities such as this are few and far between for us. Don't let this one pass you by unheeded. By-the-way, the workshop will follow morning tea also to be held in the Parish Hall. You will be most welcome!

After the Resurrection the Christian Church: "I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a Church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security. I do not want a Church concerned with being at the centre and then ends by being caught up in a web of obsessions and procedures. If something should rightly disturb us and trouble our consciences, it is the fact that so many of our brothers and sisters are living without the strength, light and consolation born of friendship with Jesus Christ, without a community of faith to support them, without meaning and a goal in life. More than by fear of going astray, my hope is that we will be moved by the fear of remaining shut up within structures which give us a false sense of security, within rules which make us harsh judges, within habits which make us feel safe, while at our door people are starving and Jesus does not tire of saying to us: 'Give them something to eat' (Mk 6:37)."
