Originating in Philadelphia USA in September 2015, this celebration has quickly captured everyone's imagination to the point where this Diocese has adopted the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time to formalise recognition of our families in this unique way. By so doing, we are not only celebrating families and family life in our parish, but also throughout our Diocese and, indeed, throughout the whole world. By focussing on families this way, we offer encouragement and support through prayer and actions to all families in our parish.
