### 25th December 2016


In the beginning was the Word: the Word was with God and the Word was God. With these words, John begins his gospel and in the verses that follow he summarises the ideas he will develop later in his gospel. The contrast between this reading and that from Luke *(during the night)* which people know well as the Christmas story, could not be more obvious. Christmas invites us to celebrate the Lord's involvement with human history, with its most insignificant and poorest people. The Lord is neither intimidated by the hostile darkness nor by the fact that his own people do not accept him. His light is more powerful than all the shadows. Entering into the hereness and nowness of our own

history; nourishing our hope with the will to live for our country's poor, these are the unavoidable conditions to dwell in the tent which the Son pitched among us. In this way, we will experience in our own flesh, in the flesh of so many brothers and sisters. the
