



FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (theme - "Expectation!"): We begin the Season of Advent today, a four week period in preparation for Christmas. For most people it will be a time of shopping and parties as normal - as in the days before the Flood - "people were eating, drinking, taking wives...then the flood came and swept all away." It is so easy to become consumed in the day-to-day, in pleasures, in the immediate concerns of living. One year leads to another year and another and another...it can all become a bit meaningless. For Christians, though, we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ. God has come to us, lived with us, taught us how to live and then died for us. In Advent, we remember that one day Christ will return. So we prepare for that also.

Christians are engaged in the shopping and partying, but it is all for a purpose. We are spiritual, not just material, and are constantly on a journey of spiritual growth. We look for Christ in our daily lives and seek to follow him. So may this be a blessed season for us all as we journey towards the Kingdom of God. This week, see if you can devote a little more time for reflection and prayer, and experience the joy and peace the Babe of Bethlehem brings at Christmas. Today, the Advent Wreath will be used for the first time this year, led at the beginning of each Mass by parish families who will introduce each week's prayer for us to share.

Week 1 — Lighting of the first purple candle: From Isaiah we read, "The people who walk in darkness have seen a great light." God of compassion, be with us as we prepare and wait for the birth of your Son, Jesus.

As the candle is lit we say: Let this candle remind us that Jesus is coming.

THE ADVENT WREATH: The circle of the wreath and the evergreens that make it up both signify God's endless mercy and undying love. Three purple candles and one rose-coloured (pink) candle are evenly spaced around the wreath. There is one larger white candle in the centre of the wreath. Each week, an additional candle is lit. As the light grows brighter each week, we are reminded that the Light of the World will soon arrive in glory. The central white candle is a recent addition to the Advent Wreath. It signifies the Light of Christ and is first lit on Christmas Eve, and then re-lit on Christmas Day.

# VINNIES "RIGHT TO HOME" CAMPAIGN

VINNIES is calling on the Commonwealth and State Governments to legislate that at least 15% of all new residential developments be for affordable housing. 28,000 people in NSW are homeless. 75% of low-income households are experiencing rental stress. Nurses, teachers, childcare professionals and other workers in essential services struggle to find a home close to their work.
