

TWO MAJOR FEAST DAYS: As we enter this third week of Lent, we celebrate important feast days for two out of the three members of the Holy Family. First is the Solemnity Feast of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and head of the Holy Family. His feast day for this year only has been transferred from its traditional date of 19 March to tomorrow (Monday, 20 March) because the Third Sunday of Lent (today) takes precedence over St Joseph's Feast. Second is Mary, the Mother of Jesus, on this the great Solemnity Feast of her Annunciation which we celebrate next Saturday, 25 March. This feast occurs exactly nine months before Christmas, Jesus' Birthday, that unique day in the history of humankind when the Son of God became man. However, this is Mary's Feast as well, for without her simple assent to God's loving plan, Jesus could not have been born among us as he was, and Christianity would, therefore, never have existed.

BLUE MOUNTAINS DEANERY MEETING: Held earlier today (Wednesday), this meeting was convened in Wentworth Falls. All priests save Fr Paul Slyney were present. The gathering received the surprising news that Fr Ted Tyler, Parish Priest of the Saint Mary MacKillop Upper Blue Mountains Parish headquartered in Katoomba, has resigned from that position. Until a replacement is found, Fr Ted will continue in the capacity of Administrator of that parish. Fr Ted also advises that, once relieved of his present commitments, he intends to retire permanently in the Upper Blue Mountains. We all wish him well in this major lifestyle change; may he enjoy a full, healthy, holy and happy life in retirement in this, God's magnificent Upper Blue Mountains garden. We who hail from Blackheath's Sacred Heart Parish particularly thank Fr Ted for his work in bringing God into the lives of so many Upper Blue Mountains people - Catholics and non-Catholics alike - these past years. GOOD FRIDAY CONTRIBUTIONS: Every year, on Good Friday, a special collection is made in every Australian parish within every Australian Diocese. Last year, 2016, in order of most funds raised, Melbourne Archdiocese ranked first, then came Sydney, third in the nation was Parramatta, followed by Perth, Brisbane, Adelaide, Broken Bay et cetera, down to number 28. That is a true reflection of how we are as 'givers' to the world's needy people. Australia-wide, a total of \$1,384,661.06 was raised of which our Parramatta share was \$126,433.30. A truly great 'Peter's Pence' effort!

An Ecumenical Milestone

The First Anglican Evensong was praved in St Peter's Basilica on the 4th anniversary of the election of Pope Francis. This celebration marks another important step in the deepening of relationships between Anglicans and Catholics. It comes just two weeks after Pope Francis' visit to the Anglican parish church of All Saints and just five months after the Pope and the Archbishop of Canterbury celebrated Vespers together at the Rome Basilica of St Gregory on the Caelian Hill." The celebration ended with a procession to the tomb of St Gregory to pray for the whole Christian church and for the spirit of wisdom on its leaders – a fitting way of marking the fourth anniversary of Pope Francis' election to the Chair of St Peter. It was, according to Bishop David Hamid of the Anglican diocese in Europe, a very moving and significant ecumenical moment:
