LENT: Wednesday next, 1st March, is Ash Wednesday, that introduces the 40-day period of Lent for 2017. Easter Sunday this year will be celebrated on 16th April, that being the first full moon after the year's March Autumnal Equinox. Lent is THE annual period of repentance, in which we each review our present lives and, where necessary, revise, and at the very least renew our Christian commitment to God and our neighbour. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their 18th year, until the beginning of their 60th year; the law of abstinence (from meat) binds those who have completed their 14th year. Catholics are also obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. We are also obliged to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation within this same period. During Lent, you will note that the 'Alleluia' and 'Gloria' are omitted at Mass, even in celebration of solemnities and feasts. Ashes will be distributed during the two Masses to be held on Ash Wednesday - the times being 9.00am and 7.30pm.

PANCAKE SUNDAY: As is our normal practice, we have brought forward to today Shrove Tuesday's celebration of pancakes!!! These will be available after Mass during our social get-together at a cost of only \$1.00 per pancake. All funds raised will be given to Caritas, our major fundraising charity this Lenten-Easter period. As is also normal practice for Shrove Tuesday, all Parramatta Diocesan priests, including me, will gather at St Patrick's Cathedral for a special Mass and meal as a precursor to Lent's arrival.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER: This year's World Day of Prayer is to be hosted by Blackheath's Anglican Church (St Aidan's), located opposite the park on the corner of the Great Western Highway and Hat Hill Road (access off Hat Hill Road). All are invited to attend this annual ecumenical service that involves every local Christian denomination. Our attention this year will be drawn prayerfully to the special needs of the women from the Philippines. This service will be held on Friday next, 3rd March commencing at 2.00pm. Light refreshments will be provided at the conclusion of prayers. Jan Roberts (4787 5252) is your contact after today's Mass. We do play an active role during this service and need at least another two ladies to undertake some of the duties that will arise therein. As well, we also need the support of as many people as possible to attend. Others support us when we host this event, so we really do need your support this time around. Thank you in advance for that support! Rev. Tim will be your host for this approximately one and a half hour prayer and social get-together!

LENTEN GROUPS: As mentioned last week, the opportunity exists for one or two Lenten family groups of about 6-8 people to jointly journey through the special scriptures that lead us through Lent to the highlight of our Christian year - Jesus' Resurrection!
