LAETARE SUNDAY: Today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is one of the two occasions in the Church year when the priest is entitled to wear pink (or should I say 'rose-coloured') vestments. This is an optional choice! Just as well, as I don't possess vestments of that hue. The word "Laetare" is taken from the first word of today's Entrance Antiphon whose translation from the original Latin means "Rejoice with Jerusalem!" By way of interest, the other Sunday authorised for the wearing of pink vestments occurs on the Third Sunday of Advent. From this Sunday forward, our attention will particularly focus on Jesus' Passion, Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection.

DIOCESAN WORKS FUND COLLECTION (DWF): Pleasing to report is the amount recently raised over the two weekends of this collection which exceeded \$1000.00. While still short-falling our required levy, this effort by you and yours has significantly exceeded past collections. Sincere thanks to everyone who contributed to this most welcome result!

ON SPECIAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Last Monday (20th March) I was privileged to concelebrate with Fr Mick O'Callaghan (Emu Plains Parish Priest) and Fr Paul (Springwood Assistant Priest) at the 2017 Annual Special Religious Education Mass celebrated at Our Lady of the Way Church, Emu Plains. Also present was a good number of catechists from every Blue Mountains Parish, including our Sacred Heart Parish, who came together to share Eucharist in company for the year now at hand. Long service and qualifying certificates were also presented to a number of recipients as part of that special celebration.
