**GREAT FEAST DAYS ARE HERE**: We are in the middle of those Sundays that are the truly great themes of Catholic life. First, today is the Feast of Pentecost in which we celebrate the descent of the Most Holy Spirit, the Advocate promised and sent by Jesus fifty days after his Resurrection. Pentecost Sunday is also the birthday of the Church! This day also concludes the Paschal period of Easter, reflected in the last featured appearance of the lighted Paschal Candle today. From tomorrow, the Paschal Candle will be returned to its traditional position close to the baptismal font. Tomorrow, we also return to Ordinary Time, that period which is anything but ordinary, which will continue to the end of this Church year on Saturday, 2nd December 2017, following the Feast of Christ the King.

Next Sunday is the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, in which we are reminded of the omnipotence of our Triune God and His infinite love for us. Our attention is also drawn to the requirement for each Catholic to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance) between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. Failure to abide by that obligation carries with it the taint of serious sin. So, it has to be action time for those who have yet to fulfil this obligation. Last of all, the Solemnity Feast of Corpus Christi - the Most Holy Body and Blood of Iesus Christ - falls on Sunday week. 18th June.

MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS: Just as May is the month of Mary, June is the month of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus whose actual feast falls on Friday. 23rd June. Throughout this month we reflect on Jesus' Most Sacred Heart, on his limitless benevolence towards us and on our complete devotion to God through his Son. We need always to remember that our God is kinder than we are. We are not written-off by God when we fail him - as tax gatherers and other unacceptable people were by the so-called 'religious' elite of Jesus' time. "Save yourself and us", one man said to Jesus on the cross. We further acknowledge that Jesus, our Good Shepherd, again and again gives of himself for his erring flock (us!), so that we feel secure in God because of our Saviour and his Most Sacred Heart. Jesus' departure from us looked to be a terrible disaster, yet we now recognise it as our central religious event, along with his Resurrection. No matter where life takes us. as it took Iesus, his love and care for us is the same love and care we try and show in his name. Our care for those in need from the pains of living will draw all to Jesus, plus the joy of sharing in God through his only Son's most loving, Most Sacred Heart.
