The depth of that hurt was made very clear to me immediately after that Mass, and since. My commentary was ill-conceived, very poorly expressed and wrong. I apologise unreservedly for all I said that was offensive to far too many of you. I am here always to help, not hurt — ever! In that aspiration I completely failed. To say that I am SORRY is to understate my feelings right now. While I cannot undo what I said, I can seek to do better in the future, and perhaps, in time to come, to once again earn the respect of those whom I have let down so badly on this occasion.

HUMAN SWINE FLU!

Bishop Kevin Manning, Bishop of Parramatta, Diocese of Parramatta has changed a number of liturgical practices within the Mass, effective immediately. These changes are being introduced to minimise the transmission of H1N1 Influenza within our parish community.

Recommends:

- During the Sign of Peace instead of shaking hands, kissing or embracing, as is practised in some parishes, it would be best to simply nod your heard and avoid bodily contact.
- When praying the Our Father, do not hold hands, as may be practised in some parishes, but simply extend hands towards heaven or fold your hands.
- Holy Communion should only be distributed under the species of the Consecrated Host AND NOT THE CHALICE to limit the spread of germs during the H1N1 epidemic.
- Prudence suggests that the reception of Holy Communion be only on the hand, but with respect for the freedom which the Holy See provides in this matter.
- Holy water from the font should not be used either when entering or departing from the Church.



Two weeks ago I travelled to the Tiwi Islands for the Funeral Mass and burial of my uncle, a Missionary of the Sacred Heart, who lived and worked with Aboriginal communities in the Northern Territory for 68 years.
