Fourth Sunday of Advent Year A


The Lord will be born very soon. Do we try God's patience by not listening or believing his promises? God implores us to listen and put our trust in him. Jesus will be called Emmanuel. 'God-is-with-us'. Does our last-minute rush in preparation for Christmas obliterate the true meaning and celebration of the day when Christ was born? May our hearts be ready to recognise Jesus when

he comes to us.

Joseph took his wife to his home. We are all aware of Mary's great 'Yes' to God's plan, but do we really acknowledge Joseph's 'Yes'. His acceptance is also part of this and is often passed over. We hear no words from Joseph (often called Joseph the Silent), but by his actions he filled the role he was given. He was the one who organised the trip to Bethlehem; he found a place for Jesus to be born; he took his family into Egypt; he was the bread-winner in an alien land; and, returning to Nazareth, he set up as a carpenter, teaching this useful skill to his son. Did Joseph listen to his heart and was this the part of him the angel spoke to? Did the course of action he'd chosen weigh heavily? Surely it was with great relief he took Mary home. Lord, like Joseph, may I pay attention to the many ways you communicate with me.

WOMAN OF GOD Ameena, an illiterate Muslim woman and I shared a 3-bed-room in hospital. She was born in Kurdistan and grew up in Lebanon. She never went to school because girls weren't allowed to in her village. To this day she cannot even write her own name. She used to come, holding her appointment card upside down, for me to tell her where she was supposed to go. She was sixteen when she was married off by her father to a youth who was only one year older. A few years later he took her to Germany where she bore him six children. It was an unhappy marriage. She never learnt proper German because her husband did not allow her to attend classes, but she made sure that all her daughters got a good education in Germany. The two of us got on quite well. She kept calling me 'woman of God' because I am a nun, and she was proud to tell me that she knows Isa and Mariam (Jesus and Mary). She just loved it when I put on my habit and veil. We used to pray together, seated on the floor, and she would ask me which direction Mecca was before starting to mumble her prayers. Whenever she was very distressed, and there was no way of comforting her, I would say 'Ameena, Allahu agbar wa-rahman' (God is great and merciful – the only Arabic phrase I knew), and He knows. When we said farewell to each other, she said, 'You, woman of God, you pray for me!' I thought it was quite remarkable for a Muslim to ask a Christian to pray for her. I often think of her.
