

SACRAMENTS

Today we are privileged to celebrate with the O'Leary family the Baptism of their ten month old daughter, **Sasha Deborah**, within the conduct of our Mass. We congratulate the parents for having taken this step which makes Sasha a full member of our Christian Family.

There are seven Sacraments, of which Baptism is the first and foundational Sacrament available within the practices of the Catholic Church. Until and unless baptised, no person can be a Christian. Nor is that person eligible to receive any of the other six Sacraments which the Church makes available to us. The Sacraments are divided into two groups – the first includes Baptism, Confirmation, Reconciliation and Eucharist, called the Sacraments of Initiation, because upon receipt of these four Sacraments, the recipient becomes a complete member of the Christian Community.

The second group is comprised of three special purpose Sacraments, these being Marriage, Holy Orders and Healing of the Sick. Very few people ever receive all seven Sacraments as the three special purpose Sacraments cater for entirely different needs. For example, it is most unlikely that any one person would be graced by the Sacrament of Marriage and Holy Orders.

While each Sacrament normally stands alone, occasionally two Sacraments may be combined into the one liturgy. Such is the case today when the Sacrament of Baptism is being performed within the structure of another Sacrament, the Mass. Another example where two Sacraments are combined would be within a Healing Mass where Anointing of the Sick is incorporated into an otherwise normal Mass. Easter Vigil is another occasion where Sacraments are combined. Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion (Eucharist) are the norm for Catechumenates on such occasions.

Finally, the Sacraments (all seven of them) are the visible expression of our faith in God, His absolute support of us and our missionary work for Him!
