Anzac Day Reflection

By the time you read this, Anzac Day will have come and gone for yet another year! Special Anzac Day services were held at Blackheath RSL consisting of a Dawn Service, later march and fraternity-the first two of which I shared! We laid a wreath at the soldiers' memorial on behalf of all parishioners. We shaped our Saturday 9am Mass to encompass a special moving Anzac Day Liturgy as a tribute



to all servicemen and women from this area who placed their lives at risk in war for our benefit.

In order to get the 'feel' for our remembrance of this day, I quote from a Dawn Service Eulogy which I led at Katoomba in 2006. "As we gather here this morning in God's world to welcome in a new day in our lives, we are reminded of another early morning on this day in 1915 – 94 years ago when, on the other side of the world, a group of volunteer Australian and New Zealand soldiers waded ashore at a small beach on the Gallipoli Peninsula to face in battle, the full force of the Turkish Army. By the end of that first day, some 2,000 of our mostly very young and inexperienced soldiers lay dead on the beach now known as Anzac Cove.

Despite overwhelming odds, our Anzacs fought on for a further eight and a half months before the remaining 35,000 troops were evacuated. By then, the same number of our soldiers, our Anzacs, had either been killed or wounded.

This same Anzac Spirit has been in evidence time and again since Gallipoli in every war and skirmish in which our armed forces have been involved. That Spirit of Anzac – the total giving of self for the greater good of loved ones, and for our nation as a whole, is why we are here this morning! It is not about war and its promotion. Never was! It is all about maintaining in ourselves and our society, those qualities of life we hold most dear – freedom, tolerance and a fair go for all! And in the tough times, commitment, courage and perseverance engaged with humanity and compassion, as we look after each other in those circumstances.

That is the message of Anzac. That message is etched in the lives of those who have returned for all wars, and in the blood of those who have died fighting for that just cause, mostly on foreign soil. May we, through the commemoration of Anzac Day, always remember them and their contribution to our way of life and the freedoms we enjoy! The Spirit of Anzac is our heritage! Ours to keep and nurture! Lest we forget!

We are called to be Easter people. May we continue to pray for our Afghan asylum seekers and for those who minister to them.

The gospel of today takes us through a range of emotions which the disciples experienced; amazement at the story of the disciples from Emmaus; terror on seeing Jesus, joy in their recognition of Jesus.

We too, are called in our daily lives to recognise the Jesus before us, those who are sick, those who are suffering, those who are oppressed and those that are our family. Peace of the Risen Lord and blessings, Monica.
