Mindfulness

In our community, we spend a few minutes each evening reflecting privately on the day that has just passed. It's a way of helping ourselves to be mindful of what has been good, what has been less good and where reconciliation with another might be needed. Some time ago, I read an article in Madonna magazine that suggested five questions to facilitate this process of reflection:

- 1. What was the best thing I heard today?
- 2. What was the best thing I saw?
- 3. What was the best thing someone did for me today?
- 4. What was the best thing I did for someone else?
- 5. What can I do to improve tomorrow?

I have been surprised to discover that the best thing someone has done for me and the best thing I have done for someone else each day has almost always been a very small thing. So small that I wouldn't have given it a second thought except for this opportunity to reflect. For example, somebody else put out the garbage. Usually I do it, but I was busy with other jobs today. An elderly sister was struggling to peg her washing on the line and I helped her. These little kindnesses make all the difference to the feel of the day and to our feelings about each other.

Thoughtfulness is catching. My sister made me a Sri Lankan 'love cake', which I shared with a Sri Lankan friend. It happened that she hadn't tasted that recipe since her mother's death many years before. My sister brought her the recipe together with the ingredients that aren't readily available here. Weeks later, my friend made her own 'love cake' and shared it with my sister. Love spreads! (JK) *from peoplespeak*
