

### A REFUGEE SPEAKS

I need to share my story with my family and friends. I come from a far country, a great distance from Australia, called Sudan. We were living in a time of war for over twenty-one years and decided to leave Sudan. When we left, we had such a hard time and life for us was quite terrible. Soldiers shot at us and many people were killed so we ran into the bush.

We walked all day every day and slept under bushes and trees and grass. We did not know where we were going; we just moved like animals in the jungle. We had very little food; if we were lucky, we would find some water in a pool and we could drink. If we were lucky enough to find some small animals, we would be able to eat. When there was nothing to eat, we simply ate the leaves from the trees. If we got sick, we found some medicine from the leaves of some trees.

We moved like animals through the bush, not knowing where we were going and often losing touch with each other. Families were separated from each other. We wandered for three years. You cannot imagine what life was like.

I thank God for the blessing of coming here to Australia with my family to start a new life, a good life. I thank the people here in Australia that God has opened their hearts to help people in need to start a new life. We are happy here though we worry about our family members whom we have left behind. I thank you all and thank my God for all that we have been given. *(Mary)*
